WHAT'S THE BEST WAY TO AVOID INJURING A WORKER AND PROTECTING YOUR BUSINESS?

- · In addition to planning and
- "Doing the Right Thing".....
- DOCUMENT THAT YOU DID IT
- Remember that even using photo documentation things might not be what they seem





HOW DO I KNOW IF I AM ABOUT TO UNDERTAKE WORK AT A CONTAMINATED PROJECT SITE OR IN CONTAMINATED CONDITIONS?

- · How about ---- ask your customer
- Use come common sense
- State contaminated site databases and registries
- · Review privately available site documentation





ASK THE CUSTOMER

- 1. Any known chemical hazards?
- 2. What was the property used for?
- 3. What am I doing exactly?





USE COMMON SENSE

- 1. Where are we working?
- 2. What's around us?
- 3. What have we heard/read about?



REVIEW OTHER PUBLIC AND PRIVATE INFORMATION

- 1. Environmental Phase Is
- 2. Environmental Phase IIs
- 3. Other environmental reports



YOU HAVE TO ASK - THE INFORMATION IS RARELY VOLUNTEERED

- Customer may not have thought about it
- · Customer may not know about it
- Customer may not care
- Customer may hope you don't "have to know" about it
- And the ever popular..... "Not my job"





MULTI-EMPLOYER WORK SITE DOCTRINE CPL 02-00-124 THERE'S OSHA – AND THERE ARE CIVIL LIABILITIES

- Worker's compensation only covers employeeemployer relationship
- Subcontractor employees may sue general contractor
- Prevention:
 - · Reasonable care to prevent/correct hazard
 - Coordination with other employers
 - Contract terms / practices with contractors
 - DOCUMENT WHAT YOU DID



(a) Each employer --

 (1) shall furnish to each of his employees employment and a place of employment which are free from recognized hazards that are causing or are likely to cause death or serious physical harm to his employees;

PLANNING FOR WORK AT ENVIRONMENTALLY IMPACTED SITES

- Review the plans and bid-specs carefully
- Ask questions *lots* of questions
- · Attend agency meetings if you can
- Document





REVIEW THE PLANS AND NOTES

- 1. Drawing notes are critical
- 2. Speak to Engineer of Record on Project
- 3. <u>Don't</u> manage by hoping for the best



In most permitting programs, each application has unique characteristics that influence its processing time. For each program listed, the standard time represents the time in which 90% of applications can be processed. Many applications will require less time; a few will require more time due to unusual circumstances.

DOCUMENT IT

- 1. Written Notes
- 2. Photos or Videos
- 3. Third Party Verification
- 4. Retain your records

- Odors
- Color
